Dear Readers,

There are changes occurring with services for older I am informing you about some choices you can make if you ever need to use more support services to help you manage at home.

Recently the Australian Government approved changes to the aged care system so that older people are supported to stay at home for as long as is safely possible.

This means that aged care providers need to be sure they offer services that really make the difference to helping older people remain safe and independent in their own homes.

We know how much you enjoy attending the social activities with Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre. We understand it is very important to be part of your social network and to keep in contact with your friends.

As your care needs change, you may be referred to other services to assist you to manage at home. If you receive a Home Care Package, you may choose to continue to attend the KCAC activities as part of the way you spend the budget that is available to support you at home.

This new approach, where you or your carer can be more involved in choosing the services you want is called Consumer Directed Care. In other words, clients and their carers can have more input and control over the types of care services they receive and the ways that these services are delivered. This means that people who are receiving a Home Care Package can decide what supports and activities are most important to them and who they want to provide these services.

So, if you are assessed for a Home Care Package, you can talk with the service provider about continuing to attend the KCAC social activities or use our Podiatry service as part of the way you spend your care budget. You can keep contact with your friends and still access the familiar KCAC services

"FALL PREVENTION" INFORMATION SESSION






Vacation care started on the 1st of July and ran for two weeks. These two vacation care weeks consisted of lots


It was a great opportunity for children to meet new friends and come together to make the most of their school holidays!

NEW "STEPPING ON" PROGRAM FOR SENIORS

Free 'Stepping On' Program at Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre

'Stepping On' is an exciting, friendly and free community program. The program will provide you with information on how to reduce your risk of falling and maximise your independence at home. Local health professionals and invited guests present the program which includes proven and effective exercises to improve your strength and balance, information on medications, home hazards, moving out and about safely and nutrition.

This program runs for 2 hours each week for 7 weeks and a follow up session in two months after the completion of the program.

Date: starting from 5 September 2013

Time: 10am to 12 noon

Venue: 30 Morgan St Kingsgrove, NSW. This program is for a person who is

over 65 years and older

living at home, able to walk independently or on a stick fearful of falling or has fallen recently

Stepping On is not suitable for people with dementia or degenerative neuromuscular conditions.

You must obtain medical clearance from your doctor before participating. It is important to wear comfortable clothes and supportive shoes for exercising.

NEW AGED CARE REFORMS—LIVING LONGER, LIVING BETTER

An update on services for older people living in their own homes

Recently the Australian Government approved changes to the aged care system as part of the Living Longer Living Better aged care reforms. These changes are responding to the strong preference of older people to stay living at home for as long as possible.

This means that community based aged care services need to ensure they are providing the services that really make the difference to helping older people remain safe and independent in their own homes.

One important part of the changes to community aged care is the introduction of Consumer Directed Care. This means that clients and their carers can have more input and control over the types of care services they receive and the ways that these services are delivered. At present, this relates to people who are receiving a Care Package – either a Community Aged Care Package (CACP) or an Extended Aged Care at Home (EACH) package.

Consumer (or self) directed care allows people to have greater control over their own lives by allowing them to make more choices (to the extent that they are able and wish so to do). The clients can choose the types of care services they receive and how those services will be delivered. This includes who will deliver the services and when.

What does this mean for clients of KCAC?

There are many different services available to help older people remain living at home. These include the centre-based day care at Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre; the regular social outings art classes, and the seniors exercise classes we provide; and our Podiatry service that many clients use.

If a client of KCAC starts receiving care as part of a Care Package, it is possible to negotiate with the packaged care provider to continue to use KCAC services. This means that you may use part of your care budget to still access the familiar KCAC services and keep your social contacts with KCAC.

The Pottery

BELOW IS SOME INFORMATION ABOUT THE BIG NEW DEVELOPMENT BEING CONSTRUCTED AT KINGSGROVE.

This new development although needed will impact on the services of KCAC. It is expected that the services for our OOSH program, Aged Care program and Family Support will increase as a result of the 96 residential apartments to house over 1000 people and their families.



KANNFINCH was responsible for both the master planning and architecture of The Pottery development in Kingsgrove, South Sydney.

The site is a disused pottery factory previously zoned for industrial use. KANNFINCH's approved design on the 7500sqm site comprises mately 15,000sqm of gross floor area, including 96 residential apartments, car parking, a 3000sqm supermarket, 980sqm of retail outlets a 150sqm of commercial space. A key innovation was placing the supermarket in the basement in order to create a new urban plaza at stree linking Mashman Avenue to Kingsgrove shops and railway station.

Better Start for Children with Disability **Registration and Information Service**



The Better Start for Children with Disability initiative provides funding for early intervention services.

Children may be eligible for Better Start if diagnosed with one or more of the following disabilities*:

- Cerebral palsy
- Deafblindness
- Down syndrome, including mosaic Down syndrome
- Fragile X syndrome with full mutation

- Hearing impairment
- Vision impairment
- Prader-Willi syndrome .
- Williams syndrome
- Smith-Magenis syndrome

- Kabuki syndrome
- Cri du Chat syndrome

 CHARGE syndrome
 - Cornelia de Lange syndrome
 - Microcephaly

To access Better Start children with an eligible diagnosis must be registered before they turn 6 years old. Families will have until the child turns 7 to access funding.


