

KINGSGROVE **COMMUNITY AID**

BEING the mother of a baby or a pre-school child can be a wonderful experience, but many mothers also find that they have to cope with feel-ings of depression, anxiety or distress

At POPPY Playgroup (Parent's Opportunity to Participate in Play with their Young) those with mental health challenges who have children aged 0 to five can find a supportive space where they can relax, meet other mums, share experiences and have fun with their children in a safe environment.

The playgroup was estab-lished in May 2011 through the initiatives of the Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre (KCAC) and runs every Monday during school terms from 10am to noon.

The playgroup supports parents to play with their children, giving particular attention to children's development and play interests and also offers information sessions featuring guest speakers to support the mothers with their mental health challenges.

Many of the participants comment on how supportive other mothers are and start the group.

They like the fact that they can be open and honest and that there is always a facilitator they can talk to.

One mum said: "I've been loving coming to this group, it encouraged me to get

with each other outside of and focus on myself and my child".

Another said: "Thank you for all your support, without this playgroup I don't know what I'd be doing".

And a third mum's comments were: "In coming to this playgroup, I've met I've met many people going through similar things and it helps you realise that you're not alone

"Even just to talk about things that parents who don't have mental illness won't necessarily understand. Even ways that I wouldn't have anticipated like, my daughter's pretty shy and even though she goes to daycare she finds playgroup less confronting as it's a smaller group".

Helping to make a real difference in life

A GAP in the local community for support groups led to Peter looking to the Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre (KCAC) for help. Four years later, and Peter is encouraging others to take the same steps he did and reach out. 'For the past four years, I've been going to support programs at KCAC.

"I joined because I found it hard to be part of society when there aren't enough inclusive support groups," he said. "I wanted to meet others who understand my experience."

The KCAC has long been a source of help, support and advice in the community, offering a range of services and programs to help a range of people including those with disabilities, the elderly, new parents, and people immigrating to Australia.

Peter said that his person-

Peter said that his personal experience with the KCAC had been amazing, and that he recommended others to reach out to the group. "I truly feel understood and valued by everyone involved.

"My advice I would give to someone who is considering joining a similar group for the first time is don't be afraid to join a group like this." he said. "It truly is such a supportive and welcoming environment, and I have grown so much as a person in my confidence, skills and abilities."

There is a variety of sun-

port groups and services available at the KCAC, and Peter said this was one of the reasons he valued the staff and support so much. "Being a part of a supportive and understanding community has boosted my confidence in interacting with others.

"I have learned effective communication and active listening which has made it easier for me to express myself and understand others," he said. "I feel more accepted for who I am and less isolated than before because there are other people in the group who have gone through similar challenges and feelings that I have experienced."

Peter said that the KCAC was a great place where people could get actively involved in activities and programs already offered, but also allowed people make suggestions for activities and to tailor support to their own needs. "I enjoy the arts and crafts activities because it makes me think more creatively, and I am able to be in control of how I want to approach the activity.

"Prior to joining the community centre, my goal was to establish meaningful relationships and feel at ease in the community while actively participating in it," he said. "Thankfully, the centre organises outings to local

shops, arts and crafts days at the centre, cafes, and even trips to places like Berry.

"These opportunities have been fortunate for me as they have allowed me to make friends within the group and practiced my social skills while out in the community, and now I feel confident engaging with other people outside of the community centre."

Both Peter and the staff at the KCAC have noticed the changes in Peter's confidence, and Peter said if anyone else was struggling, that they should join in on the fun. "Attending this group has boosted my confidence in engaging with the community, and I have noticed significant improvements in my social skills.

"Recently the group went to the grounds of Alexandria for lunch and the grounds had a Disney display," he said. "It was overall such a good time and experience enjoying the company of the other people in the group who I have formed a connection with.

YOON CHEON LIM CELEBRATES CENTENARY BIRTHDAY AT KCAC

Yoon Cheon Lim gave up playing table tennis only several months ago at the age of 99. It wasn't lack of energy that forced him to give up his favourite sport, but failing eyesight.

But table tennis is the only thing he has given up in what is an active and independent life. Mr Lim celebrated his 100th birthday on Friday, February 17 with a party at his second home, the Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre surrounded by his family and many friends.

This included his four children, ten grandchildren and two great-grandchildren.

The celerations even included a visit and congratulations from NSW Labor leader and Kogarah MP Chris Minns.

Mr Lim was born in Malaysia in 1923 and worked hard as a fitter and turner to support his family. He came to Australia in 1988 for a family reunion and liked it so much he decided to stay. He particularly liked the clean air and good lifestyle.

Mr Lim has always been very active, still lives independently, goes for a daily walk and still catches public transport.

Every Friday he travels to the Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre to meet friends and socialise with the Chinese seniors group of which is is the oldest member. Mr Lim first came to Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre almost 30 years ago to learn English and has formed many long-term friendships. At the centre he loves to sing Cantonese opera which he says is good for his memory.

And he loves to sing 'I Am Australian' in English, the song by Bruce Woodley of The Seekers and made famous in the Qantas ad. He is an expert at Mahjong and teaches his friends at the Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre how to play.

And he gets up in the early hours before every visit and makes his favourite Chinese dessert to share with everyone at the centre "He says Australia has been good for him and he's very grateful. He's had a good life here. He's been very blessed," Mr Lim said speaking through one of the volunteers at the centre, Theresa Wu. "He wishes people younger than him to have a longer life than him," Theresa said.

"He hopes the centre will flourish for years to come so everyone there can turn 100 and celebrate."

COMMUNITY INFORMATION: CHANGES TO CCS





Dear parent or carer,

RE: Important information for families using care but not registered for Child Care Subsidy

From July 2023, the Australian Government is increasing the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) for most families using early childhood education and care, which includes Outside School Hours Care. This also means some families previously not eligible for CCS will now get it.

This change will provide more support for more families across Australia.

Around 96 per cent of Australian families currently using child care – more than 1.2 million families – will be better off under these changes. No families will be worse off.

Changes from 10 July include:

- The family income limit to be eligible for CCS is increasing from \$356,756 to \$530,000 per annum.
- The maximum amount of CCS is increasing from 85% to 90% for families earning \$80,000 or less.
- Families earning between \$80,000 and \$530,000 will receive an increased CCS rate.
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander children can get at least 36 subsidised hours of early childhood education and care per fortnight, regardless of their family's activity level.

Families earning below \$362,408 with more than one child aged 5 or under in care can still get a higher rate for their second and subsequent children.

If you are **already using care but not currently registered for CCS** and your family earns below \$530,000, you may be entitled to CCS from 10 July.

If you are not currently receiving CCS, you should check your eligibility now. You will need to get a Centrelink online account through myGov or the Express Plus Centrelink mobile app.

HEALTHY RECIPES TO COOK AT HOME

Parmesan Garlic

INGREDIENTS

- 2 Firm White Fish Fillets (about 5 oz/150g each, skin off, at room temperature)
- 2 tablespoons Dijon Mustard (sub mayo)
- add Olive Oil Spray
- add Salt And Pepper
- ½ cup Panko Breadcrumbs
- 1 tablespoon Parsley (finely chopped)
- 1/3 cup Parmesan (finely grated)
- 1 Garlic Clove (minced)
- 1 tablespoon Olive Oil
- add pinch Salt



INSTRUCTIONS

- Parmesan Crumb Shove a couple of garlic cloves through a garlic crusher, mix with store bought grated parmesan (the sandy type), breadcrumbs, salt, pepper and swish of oil. Parsley is totally optional here!
- Mustard "glue" Spread mustard on the fish, just like buttering toast! The mustard is our glue for the crumb (avoid messy dredging in egg) as well as adding some flavour;
- Press fish into crumb mixture;
- Marvel at how it sticks on perfectly!
- Lay into PREHEATED skillet and pop under broiler/grill OR bake it- preheating the skillet cooks the fish on the underside while the heat elements cook it from the top and makes the crumb beautifully golden;
- 5 minutes later, marvel (again!) at how beautifully golden the crumb is and how perfectly the fish is cooked!

Healthy Banana Pancakes

INGREDIENTS

- 2 Ripe Bananas
- 2 Eggs
- 1 teaspoon Vanilla Extract
- ½ cup Quick-Cook Oats
- 1 teaspoon Cinnamon



INSTRUCTIONS

Mash bananas in a large bowl until smooth. Mix in eggs and vanilla until well combined, then mix in oats and cinnamon.

Heat a skillet to medium and add in a scoop* of the pancake batter. Smooth out to form an even layer. Cook for about 2-3 minutes until you start to see bubbles releasing from the top of the batter. Flip and cook until the other side is golden brown, about 1-2 minutes.

Garnish your pancakes with your favorite toppings! We used banana slices, chopped walnuts & maple syrup.

*Note: Use $\frac{1}{2}$ cup (65) for scooping the batter to yield 4 thicker pancakes; Use $\frac{1}{3}$ cup (40 g) to yield 6 smaller pancakes.






