INTERNATIONAL MUSIC WEEK 2023

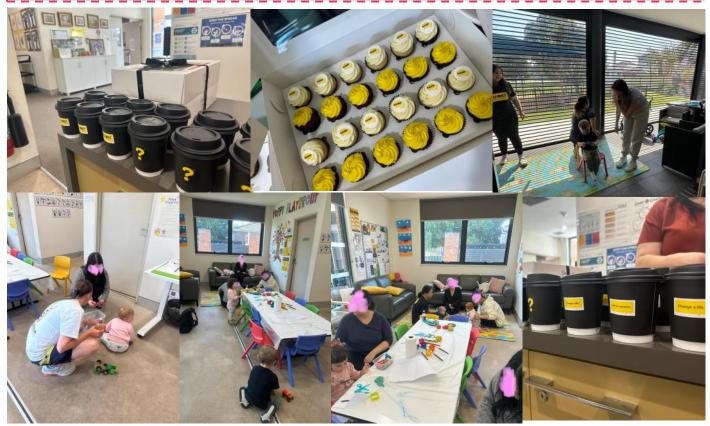

EMPOWERED SENIORS AT KCAC - LEADER ARTICLE

Empowered by Tailored Exercise





In the heart of Kingsgrove, a beacon of vitality shines as seniors gather at the Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre to embrace a journey towards better health and enhanced quality of life. Led by their dedicated trainer, Nikki, this exercise program tailored for seniors is redefining aging, proving that age is just a number when it comes to staying fit and strong. Each exercise is carefully selected to target specific muscle groups, enhance flexibility, and improve balance.

Arthritis, often considered a nemesis of the elderly, is losing

its grip as participants of the program share stories of reduced aches and pains. Nikki's approach focuses on customized strength and fitness exercises that target joint mobility and muscle flexibility, counteracting the effects of arthritis. What was once seen as an inevitable part of aging is now being challenged, one squat and stretch at a time.

Nikki's expertise extends beyond her role as a trainer; she's a motivator and friend to those she guides. Her warm smile and encouraging words create an atmosphere of camaraderie that keeps participants coming back week after week. "It's not just about physical strength, but mental resilience too," Nikki emphasises. Beyond the physical benefits, the program also addresses the mental and emotional aspects of aging. Regular exercise has been linked to improved cognitive function and a reduced risk of depression. The camaraderie that develops among participants fosters a sense of belonging and encourages social interaction, countering feelings of isolation that can sometimes accompany old age.

Gary, who attends the programme, testifies that he used to be in a wheelchair, they thought he would not walk again, and now he's walking everywhere and feeling amazing. He credits this to Nikki and the programme, saying, "I thank the KCAC exercise programme and Nikki, her enthusiasm, help and training, has made it possible for me to push through. This programme has been life changing. I am able to attend the excursions and walk around, which they said I would not do again"

Mary, marvels at her newfound ability to garden for hours without the usual back pain. These success stories speak to the effectiveness of Nikki's tailored approach, which takes into consideration individual needs and goals.

The benefits aren't just physical. Studies have repeatedly shown that regular exercise positively impacts mental health and overall well-being. The seniors at Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre are living proof. They exude a zest for life, an energy that defies stereotypes about aging. Laughter and determination fill the air as participants bond over shared milestones and personal achievements.

The success of this program lies in the rejuvenation of spirit and the newfound sense of empowerment over one's own health. Nikki's guidance empowers these seniors to reclaim their strength, not just in their bodies, but in their lives.

In a world that often overlooks the elderly, the seniors exercise program at Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre stands as a testament to the power of tailored exercise and unwavering support. With Nikki as their guide, these seniors are proving that age is no barrier to vitality, that the journey to strength and fitness is one worth taking at any stage of life.

HEALTHY RECIPES TO COOK AT HOME Fresh Vietnamese Spring Rolls healthynibblesandbits.com

INGREDIENTS

- 18 Medium Shell-On Shrimp (21/25 count, about 3/4 pounds, defrosted if frozen)
- 3 ounces Thin Rice Vermicelli (maifun)
- 1 Large Carrot (peeled and cut into thin matchsticks)
- 1 ½ Persian Cucumber (cut into matchsticks, see note 1)
- 1 Large Red Bell Pepper (cut into matchsticks)
- 1/2 cup Mint Leaves (loosely packed)
- 12 pieces Butter Lettuce (bottom tough stems removed, see note 2)
- 12 Circular Rice Paper Sheets (large 22cm)

- add Warm Water (for rolling spring rolls)
- 1/2 cup Creamy Peanut Butter
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup Filtered Water
- 2 tablespoons Rice Vinegar
- 2 tablespoons Soy Sauce
- 2 tablespoons Maple Syrup (can sub with brown sugar, see note 4)
- 1 teaspoon Toasted Sesame Oil
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup Warm Water
- 3 tablespoons Sugar
- 2 tablespoons Fish Sauce (can add more to taste)
- 1 tablespoon Lime Juice
- 1 Thai Chilli (sliced)
- 1 clove Garlic (minced)



INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Prepare the Dipping Sauce 1/2 cup creamy peanut butter, 1/2 cup filtered water, 2 tablespoons rice vinegar, 2 tablespoons soy sauce, 1 1/2 to 2 tablespoons maple syrup, can sub with brown sugar, 1 teaspoon toasted sesame oil
- 2. Taste the sauce and adjust the seasonings as necessary. I like to prepare the sauce before making the spring rolls so that the flavors have a longer time to develop.
- 3. Prepare the Shrimp: Fill a medium saucepan or small pot with water and bring it to boil on high heat.
- 4. Once the water boils, add the shrimp and cook for 2 minutes. Remove the shrimp from the water and let them cool for 5 minutes. Peel the shells from the shrimp.
- 5. Lay a shrimp on its side on a chopping board. Gently press the shrimp down with one hand and use the other to slice the shrimp in half, horizontally (knife parallel to the chopping board). Repeat with the remaining shrimp.
- 6. Prepare the Noodles: Fill a large saucepan or small pot with water and bring it to boil on high heat.
- 7. Turn off the heat. Let the noodles sit in the hot water for about 5 to 8 minutes. Double check the package directions to see how long they should sit in hot water as the cooking time varies across different brands.
- 8. Once the noodles have softened, drain and rinse the noodles under cold water. I like cutting the noodles with kitchen scissors several times so they are shorter and easier to grab.
- 9. Set Up Spring Roll Station: Fill a large bowl with lukewarm water to wet the rice paper sheets.
- 10. Transfer all the vegetables, shrimp, herbs, and noodles into bowls and arrange them on your work top.
- 11. Get a chopping board ready. Dip your hand in the water and brush water over the surface of the chopping board so that it is damp. I usually wet the surface again after every 2 spring rolls. Alternatively, lay a damp paper towel over your work surface.
- 12. Roll the Spring Rolls (refer to the photo for reference)
- 13. Quickly dip a sheet of rice paper in the lukewarm water to moisten the entire surface. This should take no longer than a few seconds.
- 14. Lay the wet rice paper on your work surface. Place a piece of butter lettuce close to the bottom edge of the rice paper. Arrange a small pinch each of rice noodles, carrots, cucumber, red bell pepper, and mint leaves over the center of the lettuce leaf.
- 15. Arrange 3 pieces of shrimp about 1 1/2 to 2 inches below the top edge of the rice paper. Make sure that the orange/pink side is facing down.
- 16. Grab the lower edge of the rice paper and lettuce and start rolling up the spring roll. Once you have reached the shrimp, fold in the left and right sides. Finish rolling up the spring roll all the way to the end.
- 17. Repeat the rolling process with the rest of the ingredients. If the chopping board is looking dry, brush some water over the board.
- 18. Serve the spring rolls with the dipping sauce.

Community welcomes news Commonwealth Bank has renewed lease on its Kingsgrove branch

The Commonwealth Bank has renewed the lease on its Kingsgrove branch for another five years.

The decision goes against industry trends which have seen a number of branches of various banks close at Kingsgrove and across St George region.

"We're proud to have served the community of Kingsgrove for many decades, " Carol Chami, Commonwealth Bank Kingsgrove branch manager said



"And are pleased we'll continue to do so at our branch on Kingsgrove Road," she said.

The move has been welcomed by Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre chief executive officer, Anne Farah-Hill.

"Kingsgrove has lost the ANZ, Westpac and St George Bank since 2020," Ms Farah-Hill said.

"Last week we invited Carol Chami, the Commonwealth Kingsgrove branch manager and her team to the Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre's annual general meeting where they wanted to present us with a check for \$500.

"During their visit they made the announcement that Commonwealth Bank had signed a five year lease on its premises at Kingsgrove Road. It was welcome news that the bank will stay and serve our seniors and also the local business community," she said.

"During Covid so many banks closed, so the Commonwealth Bank was the last bastion."

Ms Farah-Hill said many members of the seniors groups at Kingsgrove Community Aid Centre have been impacted by bank closures.

The bank closures have been a blow to the many seniors who require physical assistance as they are not too savvy with internet banking. The alternative is the bigger branches in Hurstville and Kogarah which can be difficult for seniors to access.

"I'd like to commend the Commonwealth bank for keeping its Kingsgrove branch open," Ms Farah-Hill said.

"We are also starting to educate our seniors on how to use the bank ATM, credit cards and internet banking," she said.

"There's a sense of relief in the community. A lot of seniors have moved their banking over to the Commonwealth. It's a very busy branch."

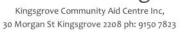

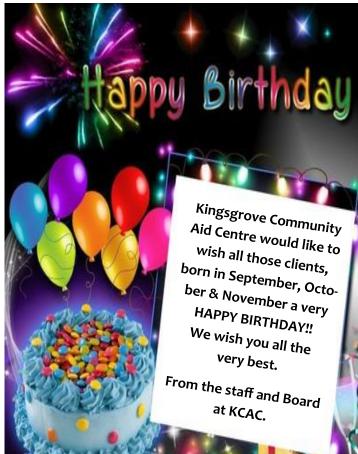
